The agenda for 17th March meeting of the Local Area Committee of Governors included presentations from two of the senior leadership team at the academy. Vice Principal, Emily Thomason provided a comprehensive update on the curriculum with governor scrutiny focusing on the assessment plans that are in place for Y11; Assistant Principal, James Morris, explained the initiatives in place to promote good behaviour and positive attitudes both inside and outside of lessons across the academy. 




# **TESTING THE 'LITTLE GREY CELLS'**
