






Exams have changed- again!

The current GCSE exams:

- Make more demands of students, to help them achieve as much as students in countries with the best education systems.
- Are awarded in grades from 1 up to 9, with grade 9 being the highest grade.
- In most subjects, students will not be grouped in different ability tiers for the purposes of assessment – only maths, sciences and languages will have different papers for different groups of students.

The average GCSE student completes-




GCSE Subjects:

- Most GCSE subjects have 3 exams which are taken at the end of the 2 year course.
- Science has 6 exams and is worth 2 GCSE grades and English has 4 exams, again worth 2 GCSE grades (covering English literature and English language).
- In Design Technology students are expected to sit an exam (40%) and complete a practical assessment (60%).
- In Drama, students have a written paper (worth 40%) and two performances (worth 20% and 40%) during November and March.
- In Music students complete an externally assessed exam, worth 40% and complete two internally assessed pieces of work (worth 30% each) in January and June.
- In Art, this year, students will continue to work on their coursework from lessons to submit in the summer.

Vocational Subjects:

- In BTEC and OCR Nationals students sit a short exam, usually in summer Year 10 or January of Year 11, worth 40% of the total grade. The majority of their grade relies on coursework completed in class.
- In Hospitality & Catering, students complete a short written paper (worth 40%) in Year 10 and then complete a 9 hour practical in Year 11 (worth 60%).

THOUGHTFUL THURSDAYS (@tnha_year11) is a supervised space open to all Year 11 students for a calm space to revise, read, find help with revision timetables, share their concerns about exams or catch up on coursework/homework, 3:15-4:15pm.

ENGLISH Intervention is running during lesson time with intensive targeted small groups. Students will be invited by English teachers to attend.

SCIENCE Intervention is running during Wednesday lunchtimes in Rm5. All Year 11 students are welcome to attend.

VOCATIONAL SUBJECTS (Business Studies, Travel & Tourism, Computer Science, Design & Technology, Hospitality & Catering and Health & Social Care) also run coursework catchup every lunchtime in Rm36 for Year 11 students. Design & Technology runs practical catchups at lunchtime on a Thursday in the DT Workshop. *: All vocational students are welcome to attend the 'Vocational Subjects' intervention on any day listed above; if students would like targeted support they should attend on the day their teacher is present.

DRAMA Intervention is running both lunchtime and afterschool on available days for KS4. Students should book with Mr Hatfield.

MUSIC Intervention is also run every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday lunchtime, all years are welcome. Friday lunchtime is Band Club exclusively, all in Rm28.

ART Intervention is also run every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday lunchtime for KS4 students only in Rm25, in addition Friday lunchtime is 'open house' to all year groups but must be booked with Mrs Morgan.

Subjects not mentioned on this list are not currently offering intervention, however this timetable will be reviewed each half term and published accordingly. Students should ask their subject teachers if in any doubt.

On the day....

- You must sit your exams in your correct school uniform.
- Please try to get to the exam room at least 15 minutes before it starts.
- Remember to bring all of your equipment- <u>black</u> pens, pencils, ruler, rubber, pencil sharpener.....
- Pencil cases must be see-through, leave any revision notes in your bag, hand in

mobile phones and take off your watches.



If you are feeling poorly.....

- If you cannot make the exam it is important that you let us know as soon as possible.
- Exam boards are very strict- they will ask for evidence of illness so you must collect a doctors note.



If you are **late**- call us. Try to get here as quickly as possible. You may still be able to sit your exam.

Social media and exams.

- Under <u>NO</u> circumstances are exams or exam questions to be discussed on <u>ANY</u> social media platform.
- The exams regulator (JCQ) monitors these platforms for any mention of exam material.
- If you do post about exams related topics, they will investigate the circumstances and it can affect your grade.
- Penalties can be as severe as your result being excluded and if this happens you will receive an automatic U grade.

What we can do at TNHA....

- Quality first teaching- active learning, well planned lessons, professional staff.
- Regular assessment- mock exams, in class assessments, use of exam papers.
- GAP analysis- targeting areas for development identified in assessments.
- Intervention sessions- lunchtime, afterschool, weekends, school holidays.
- Transport home from intervention.
