


### **News from our Physical Education Faculty**

As part of our whole school 'promoting physical activity strategy', we have regular sporting competitions which we run during the academy day. These enable a wider range of students to access them. ## **MUSEUM ASSOCIATES WORKSHOP**

Students have been working alongside artist Ian Brownlie to create an intervention into the gallery at Swaffham Museum. Over the next 12 weeks the group, (who have signed up for the Young Museum Associates Programme), will be creating work around the theme of conflict.

They will 'disrupt' the gallery in Swaffham Museum and create an exhibition to spark younger people's interest. During the first workshop, our students created Zines (a self-published work) filling their own Zine with collaged imagery relating to Swaffham and the town's history.



## LAYING DOWN THEIR 'TRACK'

On Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> January, TNHA students represented the academy at a prestigious event in London. Following collaboration with 'Never Such Innocence' founded by Lady Lucy French OBE, a charitable organisation that promotes the voices of young people on the subject of conflict, students were invited to share their work with a group of esteemed guests at the Houses of Parliament.



In November 2021, 'Never Such Innocence' visited the academy to conduct song writing

workshops with several English classes on the theme of remembrance. On the day of the sessions students had the opportunity to work with a recording artist Otto; the result of which was the creation of a song!

Fast forward a year and students were thrilled to be asked to perform their song at the event at Westminster. The day began with a visit to the famous Hackney Road Studios in Bethnal Green to record the song with a sound engineer. Students were able to experience the process of professional recording and very much enjoyed singing together in the booth before previewing their work with the engineer.

A quick hop on the tube saw the group at their next stop, the Houses of Parliament.

After walking through the great Westminster Hall to see the commemoration plaque where the late HM Queen Elizabeth had lain in State, students were shown to one of the select committee rooms to meet with the other performers and guests. In attendance at the event were Lady Lucy French, Rachel de Souza (Children's Commissioner for England), several MPs and high-ranking representatives from the Ministry of Defence.



## **CURRICULUM DAY AT TNHA**

In our second curriculum day of the year students were taken off their usual timetables to enjoy various sessions based around PSHE and Careers topics, appropriate to the Year group they are in. Curriculum Days run to compliment the tutor time and LOOL lessons students experience and prepare them for life in modern Britain. At TNHA we believe it is crucial to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum that enables our students to develop in many diverse aspects of life and to build confidence and resilience. This will in turn allow them to be prepared for their adult lives and to engage with society.

We welcomed many visitors delivering sessions to include:- first aid, careers, dangers of smoking and vaping, internet safety, puberty, STEM, radicalisation, gambling addition, good spending habits, interview skills, similarities and differences in religions, dangers of drugs, healthy relationships, road safety, mental health and exam stress.
