




#### A HOME FOR A HEDGEHOG



Ms Ball, as many will know, has many 'strings to her bow' and indeed hidden talents and interests. She has been looking out for our very treasured guests many of whom visit us in our gardens and are a common and welcome sight.

For some months she has been feeding the hedgehogs who Visit her, even buying a rather grand iglo feeding station after catching a 'wiley fox' eating all the food one night. However, during a very hot week in July when the mercury hit over 30 degrees, coughing and wheezing was heard in the flower beds. On closer inspection, a smallish hedgehog was found on their back, clearly in a bad way.

At the time Ms Ball admits to being a complete novice but knew enough to know that a hedgehog out in broad daylight, wheezing and making no attempt to move, was not a good sign. Taking to 'Google' she soon found Ryston Rachel's Hedgehog Hotel, a registered charity in Downham Market. Rachel organised for the hog, soon to be sexed and named Victoria, to be picked up within 30 minutes and whisked away to help. To cut a long tale short, Ms Ball is now registered with the charity as a 'safe home for hedgehogs' and has taken in three to live with the ones who already visit her garden regularly.

#### How can we help?

Don't always expect your visitors to live in your garden, they can travel several kilometres a night.

#### But please do:

- Put out a shallow bowl of water,
- A dish of cat biscuits, not fish flavoured
- A dish of wet cat food, jelly, again not fish.

The most important thing is to have a hole in your fence on either side, so that the hogs can travel in

the safer back gardens, rather than down pavements and across roads. At this time of year, the male hogs are preparing to hibernate. Yes, the males go to bed a month before the females!

Also please check that you haven't locked a hog in any sheds, garages or green houses that may have been open in the summer.

If you cannot stretch to buying a hog hibernating house, please leave some hay or leaves nearby so that they can make a nest inside.
