
Attendance remains key to outcomes, and I know the academy continues to work hard to ensure all students are in school at all times, albeit the recent run of colds and bugs has not been helping!

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION



Our 'Faculty Focus' for autumn is the Vocational Faculty which comprises of Business Studies, Health & Social Care, Child Development, Travel & Tourism, Design Technology, Computer Science and Food Technology.

Studying these subjects allow students to gain practical skills and knowledge and to explore career paths leading to a range of university subjects such as engineering, law and nursing or to apprenticeships and higher education courses.

Community is the Key

In Business, Year 11 students have been completing their business plans for their Enterprise Coursework. This year ideas have to be based around art and design, sport and exercise, and animal and horticulture. Some students have used the opportunity to show their 'green' credentials, with ideas such as recycling football shirts & boots whereas other have gone for a more social enterprise approach supporting the community with gardening and dog walking. Students will soon move onto the presentations, pitching their idea. Good luck Year 11!



Business Studies

Great Communication in Health & Social Care

Meanwhile, in Health & Social Care students have been showcasing their communication skills in both one-to-



one and group scenarios. It was a change from having to write long pieces of work and once the nerves were steadied, students did a wonderful job, showing they are extremely capable individuals. Just as importantly we are nearly there with the coursework! This is something they should be very proud of as they can all congratulate themselves for having worked so hard.

The first assignment for Year 10s is to interview an individual of a certain age and find out how they have developed in their physical,

intellectual, emotional and social development, as well as how factors have impacted this. The students are approaching this with high levels of maturity and we are proud of them.

Child Development

Both Year 10s and Year 11s are working on the same unit of work – how a child develops. The Year 11s are further ahead and have been to observe a child who is 2-3 years of age and noted their development for their age. They have also planned a play activity with the child and evaluated this. As with the Health and Social Care the coursework has almost been completed. Year 10s are preparing for the observation and getting their notes ready to help them observe the development.



The Year 10s have worked really hard on this and are confident and ready to tackle this first task. Both Year Groups deserve high praise indeed.

Travel & Tourism



Year 11 Travel and Tourism students are currently completing their Component 2 controlled assessment. The skills that the students learn in the Customer Service unit will be vital in their future careers, whatever sector they are employed in.

The Year 10 students are researching and investigating destinations in the UK ranging from the 4 nation's capital cities; to historic venues such as Bath and York; to our unique coastal areas and our breath-taking countryside areas. We will shortly start our first pieces of coursework.

In Design Technology the Year 11 GCSE groups have completed their themed chairs featuring some of their favourite characters. These are ready for the annual display in the foyer. They are of a higher quality than in previous years demonstrating excellent artwork, design and woodworking skills as well as some good imaginative ideas. The engineers in Year 10 are producing some very good quality tack hammers some of which match almost exactly the dimensions they have to work to.





Python Skills in Computer Science

Whilst in Computer Science Year 8 have become budding programmers by learning to ask for and store data, perform arithmetic then output it all using Python programming. This year, we have further developed the Python Skills for Year 9. They will build on their previous programming knowledge to be able to add logic to their programmes to make them smarter as well as repeating instructions to save on typing out so much code! Year 10 are recapping all of their previous programming skills and dialling them up to 11 then moving onto



structured programming, lists and random numbers. Year 11 have just finished learning about hardware, software and other aspects of computer systems and will move onto computer networks next.

Food Technology

Year 11 students are due to start their practical exam, where they have to plan, design, make and review a 2-course meal. This is just a sample of their tempting dishes.







WELCOMING NEW FAMILIES

Out on the Water

Whilst undertaking work in school our older students will also be required to take trips outside of the classroom as part of their PE course. The first trip for our intrepid Year 10 students involved taking to canoes at Whitlingham Country Park in Norwich, as part of their Outdoor Adventurous Activities Unit, where their skills on the water were assessed.

On a glorious sunny day, the students learned about the equipment required, safety precautions needed, different strokes which could be used to manoeuvre the canoe and also took part in some team building games.



Year 11 Academic Evening



This event was designed specifically to support students and their families in preparing for the upcoming mock and final GCSE examinations. The focus of the evening was on effective revision techniques across the core subjects of Mathematics, English, Science, History, and Geography. The session was practical and interactive, offering parents and carers the opportunity to sit alongside their child and try out a range of proven strategies to help them revise effectively at home. Following the main session, there was time to speak directly with teaching staff from all subject areas providing a valuable opportunity to ask questions about

specific exams, the format and expectations of each exam, key content and how best to prepare and the resources available for support.

In addition, we were pleased to welcome a number of Post-16 providers who were available on the evening to speak with students and families about their next steps after Year 11. A Careers Advisor was also on hand to offer guidance on future pathways and opportunities, as well as a Mental Health advisor from 'Cup-O-Tea' (wellness and therapy service).

TNHA took 34 students to Kings Lynn for the area championships at the start of October. These students ranged from Year 7 to Year 11. All students completed the course and finished within the top 40 of their age group against the best runners from all of the schools within our area.

The Year 10's and Year 11's boys and girls did particularly well as a team with all of them finishing in the top 20 for boys and top 15 for girls.

The competition also acted as a trial for selection for the West Norfolk Combined team to race in the Norfolk Championships later in the year. Of our 34 students taken, 10 of them have been selected to represent the area in these forthcoming championships. An amazing ratio of selections from our academy.
