Future Stars: An inspiring university programme for Year 7 students

As you may already know, we have a close working relationship with the UEA who are able to offer us as an academy a lot of exciting opportunities for our students that help with future aspirations, especially geared towards considering university as an option. Your child has been selected to take part in three workshops run by the UEA entitled 'Future Stars'. Future Stars is a fun introduction to university and is offered to Year 7 students who would benefit from an opportunity to learn more about university study and student life.

Future Stars aims are:

- For students to experience a positive introduction to university study and life.
- To learn about university and possible future career pathways.
- To discover how students learn at university.
- To explore the UEA campus and student accommodation.

The Future Stars programme includes:

- An in-school one hour workshop about university and possible future careers which includes meeting UEA students and asking questions. This will take place on **Wednesday 14th January 2026**
- A student activity booklet with lots of information about university study and life.
- A visit to the UEA campus which includes fun learning activities such as a campus tour, a session with an author, a chance to play pickleball and a go at the climbing wall. This takes place on **Tuesday 27th January 2026**. Please see below for more details.
- A second in-school workshop to reflect on the UEA campus visit, answer questions and award students with certificates and medals for taking part. This will take place on **Friday 30th January**.

Please note that the times of the visit to the university on Tuesday 27th January will require us to leave the academy at 8.00 am and we will not return until 3.30 pm, so students will not be able to catch the bus home from the academy, and possibly not to school, depending on when their school transport arrives at the academy (therefore you may need to make the necessary transport arrangements). We will travel to the UEA by a coach provided by the UEA with one of their partner companies. Mrs. Taylor, Student Support Leader, will accompany the students on the trip.

Dress code for the day will require students to wear their TNHA PE uniform, as they will be taking part in 2 sports activities.

For the visit to the university, they will also need to bring a packed lunch and drink with them, unless they are FSM, in which case we will organise food and drink for them for the day.

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
